
Genesis 9:15-16

Some of our activities with the SON staff & Volunteers has included....... Mkoko Village

 Teaching at the primary school how God created the world, his love for us and the kind of behavior that shows our love for him. Joyce & Rahab created a specific lesson for them and many of the children acknowledge that they needed forgiveness.





- Playing Games and encouraging the school children.
- Education about Maternal & Children's Health at the monthly clinic. Niwaely is doing a great job working with these women.



- · Showing the Jesus Film in the village
- Leading a discussion with grades 6 and 7 at the primary school about puberty and positive
 ways to deal with the changes, which led to another session where discussions were
 reviewed, the girls sewing reusable pads, and the boys helping to repair the floor of the
 girls toilet.



• Worshiping with the small church congregation and teaching the children who attended the service about David and Goliath.



• Getting to know Pastor Ester. She is a widow with 6 children who upon learning from another pastor that the little church in Mkoko Village was in need of a pastor, moved with 5 of her children to live in the village. She proved to be a great speaker/teacher during the Friday worship time. She is a sweet humble woman, who has a very difficult life. She has been working in the fields with the village women, they are paid by the rows of onions they harvest. The wages are 1000 Tsh per 3 rows....a typical day includes 30 rows which results in 10,000 Tsh or about \$5.



Praise the Lord! Niwaely, Ester and Rahab were able to chat with and pray with Mama Kulvent a
widowed Muslim with a heart condition and she said she was tired and need to have Jesus!

WASH Education (That's Water, Sanitation & Hygiene)

Continues with a new group of class 6 students in Morogoro Town Primary Schools. This semester is a bit shorter that normal so we are trying to consolidate a couple of the lessons.

This is an area where we have started to include in our education programs. We are investigating a few possibilities and are looking for support and funding for this type of project that we would include as a part of our WASH training. We learned that Joyce is quite the seamstress!
